

# Supervision Institute 2013



In relation to state licensing requirements, the Montana Association of School Psychologists in collaboration with the Montana Office of Public Instruction will be offering supervision training for experienced Class 6 School Psychologists in the Spring of 2013.

Successful applicants will have at least three years full time experience and be willing to offer supervision to Class 5 school psychologists holding an alternative license who are completing their formal internships within districts.

The two day course will be based on the 2010 National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) Practice Model and taught by staff from the University of Montana, Missoula and members of the MASP Credentialing Review Board.

This year training will be held at the University of Montana, Missoula on March 22nd and April 26th 2013. Lodging will be provided for March 21st and April 25th.

The course will include both group work and independent study.

Office of Public Instruction recertification credit will be available or one continuing education credit from the University of Montana based on a minimum of 15 hours attendance.

A small stipend will be offered to School Psychologists who complete the course and subsequently offer supervision to a Class 5 candidate.
