Conference Features

Stepehn E. Brock, Ph.D., NCSP, LEP is a Professor and the School Psychology Program Coordinator in the College of Education at California State University, Sacramento (CSUS). He is the current President of the National Association of School Psychologists (NASP) and has been a member of NASP since 1985. His involvement in NASP has included serving as a Contributing Editor to the *Communiqué* (the NASP newsletter), participating on the Editorial Advisory Board of the *School Psychology Review*, serving as a member of the National Emergency Assistance Team, and being co-chair of the PREPaRE Crisis Prevention and Intervention Training Curriculum workgroup. He is the lead editor of the NASP publication *Best Practices in School Crisis Prevention and Intervention (2nd ed.)* and lead author of *School Crisis Prevention and Intervention: The PREPaRE Model*. Dr. Brock received NASP's Presidential award in 2004 and 2006, and the Crisis Management Interest Group's Award of Excellence in 2006 and 2007.

A Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP) and Licensed Educational Psychologist (LEP), Dr. Brock worked for 18 years as a school psychologist with the Lodi (CA) Unified School District (the last 6 of which included assignment as Lead Psychologist) before joining the CSUS faculty. As a school psychologist he helped to develop the district's school crisis response protocol, served on an autism specialty team, and specialized in functional behavioral assessment. His curriculum vitae lists over 230 publications and over 150 invited or refereed state/national/international conference presentations.

Conference Features

This workshop provides critical information useful to school psychologists and other school mental health providers as we build our skills for supporting students. Participants will be able to identify the prevalence of common mental health challenges faced by school-aged youth.

Conference participants will be able to identify the consequences of mental illness on student learning; strategies for identifying mental illness among school-aged youth; and approaches for promoting mental health.

Additional skills gained from this workshop include identifying the prevalence of common traumatic stressors; understanding the basic elements of an approach to helping students cope with stressful events (PREPaRE Model of crisis intervention); and learning the unique elements of the form of crisis intervention known as suicide postvention.

With the publication of the DSM-5 and participation in this workshop, attendees will be able to identify changes to the classification system; changes to selected specific DSM-5 criteria; and understand the history, development, and controversies associated with the DSM-5.

The final piece of this workshop will allow participants to identify the characteristics of PTSD, the causes; assessment; and strategies for preventing and responding to PTSD. Special Feature –mini workshop on Wednesday evening with fellow colleagues sharing knowledge on practices that are useful and practical for meeting the mental health needs of students in our schools.
